Introduction to worship: Psalm 48:8-14

As we have heard, so we have seen in the city of the Lord Almighty, in the city of our God: God makes her secure forever Within Your temple, O God, we meditate on Your unfailing love. Like Your name, O God, Your praise reaches to the ends of the earth; Your right hand is filled with righteousness. Mount Zion rejoices, the villages of Judah are glad because of Your judgments. Walk about Zion, go around her, count her towers, consider well her ramparts, view her citadels, that you may tell of them to the next generation. For this God is our God for ever and ever; He will be our guide even to the end.

The Psalmist wants God's people to speak of all God has done, take a moment to thank God for all He has done in your life that you can speak to others about.

An opportunity to enjoy God's forgiveness (A confession based on Psalm 67.)

We recognise our inability at times to speak out as we should as we say

O God, we express our sorrow and repentance for our moments of hopelessness and
doubt. Forgive us for the times when we become so burdened by our cares and worries
that we forget what You have spoken to us in Your Word. You are God, and Your words
are trustworthy and true. We know and we believe that You are the same yesterday,
today, and forever. We remember how You have cared for Your people in the past, You
are with us in our present circumstances, and Your rule and Your reign extend forever.
Whenever we experience hopelessness and doubt, give us assurance through Your Word
and by Your Spirit. You, Lord, are our salvation and our God. We turn from our sins and

Almighty God, who in Jesus Christ has given us a kingdom that cannot be destroyed, forgive us our sins, open our eyes to God's truth, strengthen us to do God's will and give us the joy of His kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Gracious God, we have experienced Your great love and the good news of Your Gospel in our lives. May we know what is the hope to which You have called us: the hope of eternal life. May our hearts burn with the words of the Great Commission — so that we long for You to make disciples of all nations. Make us aware of opportunities to bear witness to the greatness, the glory, and the goodness of our Saviour. In these days give us boldness to proclaim the hope of redemption in Christ and the promise of eternal life, for the glory of Your name. Amen
